

St Francis Catholic Primary School

PE and Sports Premium Report 2015-2016



The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 to 2016/17 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Our school is currently ensuring that this funding targets areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children. All schools have received a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the last two academic years.

Purpose of Funding

Our school has spent the funding on improving our provision of PE, school sports and the wellbeing of pupils.

How St Francis Catholic Primary School used the funding?

Our school used the money to help provide more opportunities for children to compete in sporting activities and tournaments. Competing in different sporting activities has been provided to all children including those that are gifted and talented, e.g. Competitions at local schools including Streetly Comprehensive, St Francis Technology College and various Primary Schools and at the Alexander Stadium and Walsall Town Hall.

Professional development opportunities have been organised to improve the standard of teaching in physical education within our school. This will ensure an impact is maintained throughout the school even when the funding stops. This will continue to take place in 2016/17.

Promoting healthy lifestyles has become a priority within the school with the help of more after-school clubs being available to the children within our school. Healthy eating has also become a main focus, with careful monitoring of lunchboxes and school dinners taking place.

Quality assured professional development resources have been purchased to support the teaching of physical development within our school.

Opportunities have been provided for all pupils, especially for pupil premium children who are gifted and talented, to work with secondary schools and outside agencies to enhance sporting capabilities.
