### Projected PE and Sports Premium Strategy 2017-2018

The Government is providing funding to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Our school is currently ensuring that this funding targets areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children.

This academic year, the projected funding for our school is £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil in Years 1 to 6. In most cases, the Government determines how many pupils are in our school and therefore attracting the funding using data from the January 2017 school census.

The Department for Education & the Education Funding Agency will publish the school level breakdown of funding for the academic year 2017 to 2018, including conditions of grant, in October 2017.

#### Purpose of Funding

The funding should be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer. This means that we will use the funding to:

- Improve our provision of PE, school sports and the wellbeing of pupils.
- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

- \*Improve opportunities for children to access inter- and intra-school competition
- \*Broaden sporting opportunities and experiences available to children including developing intra-school competition that are pupil-led.
- \*Improve the provision of PE at St Francis Catholic Primary School by staff development and resource development.
- \*PE provision is judged as good by external monitoring as measured by the Bronze sports mark.
