By the end of this unit children will...

Throughout history, within and beyond living memory, children will learn the causes and effects of major events. They will learn how shared events can bring communities together and unify them. With this, they will explore how the Common Good is brought about through the unification and building up of the whole of society, not just meeting the needs of individuals. Through the greatest commandment of love of God and love of neighbour, Year 2 will develop an understanding of how each of us has a responsibility to others within and beyond our immediate communities.

The children will write a non-chronological report about London. They will further to this write a chronological report about the Great Fire of London.	To explore and compare differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive by thinking about life processes. To use observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions by explaining how they know something is living, dead or has never been alive. To identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, by mapping a habitat and identifying its inhabitants.

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Children will further develop their understanding of the basic and fundamental principles of invasion games such as attacking, defending, scoring and teamwork.

Gym

Children will learn to role in different ways including introducing the skill of a crouched forward roll. They will jump from a springboard and begin to do a handstand. They will learn to develop body tension, control and balance.

In this unit, children will learn the difference between good and bad secrets. They will also explore the risks of being online. The children will learn some basic first aid, what makes a 999 emergency and what they should do if they are in an emergency situation.
