By the end of this unit children will have a deep understanding of our environment and how we, as humans are affecting the world we live in. Children will be using their previous knowledge of types of land and how it can be used in order to explore how we are using the land we live in correctly/incorrectly.

Additionally children will be thinking about how we, as a Catholic community, can help to combat the effects that are being seen in our wider society. They will show an understanding and care for all creation and explore ways in which they can make a stand to change what is happening.

Through this unit of work children will come to deeper understanding of how they can fulfill their role as "fighters for sustainability."

Traditional Tales - Fables The children will explore a range of Aesop's Fables (e.g. the tortoise and the hare, the ant and the grasshopper) and write a new fable to convey a moral, linking to caring for God's earth. The children will include expanded noun phrases to describe and specify characters in their fable. 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Foundation Subjects

History and Geography

Geography

During this half term children will be celebrating and exploring God's earth through:

- Understanding that the food we eat comes from many different places around the world.
- Knowing how land in temperate climate zones is used to produce food.
- Explaining how land is used to produce food in the UK.

Computing

Sound - Podcasting

The children will research and prepare information to share with an audience, answering our big question. They will prepare an introduction for the podcast, introduction for the episode and structure the information into segments or sections into an order that makes it easy to understand and follow. They will also create artwork for the podcast with Keynote. The children will record their audio in Keynote using their script before ensuring it is all in the correct order before exporting it as a video.

Physical Education

Net and Wall Games

The children will learn some of the key skills players need to play games that involve either a net or a wall. Children will take part in a range of footwork drills and learn the basic grip for holding a tennis racket.

<u>Yoga</u>

The children will be learning and taking part in yoga. They will learn the different stretches and movements and how this has a good impact on our bodies. They will look at why it is important to keep their bodies healthy and what would happen if they did not.

Art and Design and Design Technology

Art:

During this half term children will be celebrating and exploring the many gifts of God's creation through:

- Drawing vegetables in charcoal and making them in clay.
- Drawing and painting fruits and vegetables in colour.
- Designing and making fruits and vegetables with fabric.

Music

<u>Creating compositions in response to an animation (Theme: Mountains)</u>

Learning to tell stories through music. Listening to music and considering the narrative it could represent. Paying close attention to the dynamics, pitch and tempo and how they change. Creating original compositions to match an animation, building up layers of texture.

PHSE

Created and Loved by God

Created and Loved by God explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.
